- 1. National Primary Learning Assessment System (including a policy and an implementation framework) and will commence its rollout across the country early academic year 2021/2022 or September 2021.
- 2. National School Infrastructure Strategy to commence its implementation beginning October 2021
- 3. National Strategy for Planning and Managing the Teaching Workforce (under development)
- 4. Revised Policy on Girl's Education (at finalization stage)
- 5. National Gender Action Plan with a goal to aggressively increase girls' access to education and involvement of females in major sector-programs
