PLEDGE FROM THE CHILDREN'S INVESTMENT FUND FOUNDATION GPE Second Replenishment Conference June 26, 2014

Michael Anderson speech in Pledging Zone

We are facing <u>lost generations of children</u> in Africa, Asia, and the rest of the world. 250 million children either fail to make it to Grade 4, or fail to reach a minimum level of learning. The human and economic cost of this failure is incalculable.

CIFF's vision for education – a vision we share with the Global Partnership for Education – is to transform the life prospects for this and future generations of children, by ensuring that <u>all children can read</u>, <u>write and do basic mathematics</u> by the time they are 8 or 9 years of age.

The evidence is clear that the foundations for learning begin in the early years. It is for this reason that I will be proud to announce in the parallel session later today a <u>'Call to Action for Early Childhood Care and Education'</u>. I invite you to endorse this Call to Action, which calls for significantly increased domestic and international investment – including through the GPE – in early childhood education.

I am also proud to tell you that CIFF is committing today up to \$22 million US dollars to the GPE over the 4 year term of this replenishment:

- i. <u>\$20 million to the GPE Fund</u>, to pay for improvements in learning outcomes within performance-based funding of GPE programme implementation grants;
- ii. <u>\$2m to support monitoring and evaluation of performance-based funding of learning outcomes.</u>

Together with other foundations committing resources today, these constitute the first financial commitments to the Global Partnership for Education from private philanthropy.

By paying for <u>improvements in learning outcomes</u>, we are inviting developing country partners to focus their education plans, their investments, and their own accountability, on what should be at the heart of every child's education: learning.
